

Creation of new research groups at Institut Pasteur

Outstanding candidates are invited to apply for independent group leader positions on the Institut Pasteur campus in Paris, France, to reinforce strategic priorities:

- Emerging Infectious Disease with a focus on the interaction of epidemiological dynamics and evolution of pathogens
- Antimicrobial resistance and novel antimicrobial strategies
- Neuroscience: brain function and disease, in particular, leveraging the use of human models.
- Microbiome in human health
- Single cell biology
- Immunology with a focus on immunotherapy and cancer
- Novel vaccine approaches

Institut Pasteur is a non-profit private foundation dedicated to fundamental, interdisciplinary research and to the translation of knowledge for applications in medicine and public health (<https://research.pasteur.fr/en/departments/>). Located in central Paris, it offers an outstanding and unparalleled research environment with state-of-the-art research laboratories, 20 technology platforms (<https://research.pasteur.fr/en/center/c2rt/>), and a large bioinformatics and biostatistics support hub (<https://c3bi.pasteur.fr/hub/>).

Depending on their previous experience, successful candidates will be appointed with a tenure track position to head a group of 6 (G5 track) or 8 people (G5+ track), the latter if they have a previous recognized PI experience of at least 2 years. These groups will be created for a period of 5 years and may thereafter compete for a 10-year full research group (U10).

Highly attractive packages to match the experience of the candidate will be provided, including institutional salaries (Principal investigator, technician, post-doctoral fellows), a substantial contribution to running costs and equipment, access to on campus state-of-the-art technology core facilities, as well as support for relocation expenses and administrative issues.

Eligibility: G5 track junior group leaders must be less than 8 years after PhD, while G5+ track group leaders must be less than 12 years after PhD at the time of submission. For the G5 track, **women are eligible up to 10 years after their PhD if they have one child and up to 12 years after their PhD if they have two or more children. For the G5+ track, women are eligible up to 14 years after their PhD if they have one child and up to 16 years after their PhD if they have two or more children.** Exceptional candidates who do not meet these criteria could nevertheless be considered.
